### O'Banion Publishes Essay



Associate Professor of History Patrick J. O'Banion served as Felix Gilbert Member (2017) in the School of Historical Studies at the world-renowned Institute for Advanced Study in Princeton, NJ over the past academic year.

The Institute for Advanced Study recently published an essay from O'Banion, entitled "[Peace and Quiet in Castile: Baptized Muslims, Feudal Lords, and the Royal Expulsion.](#)"

O'Banion's work examines the relationship between Christianity and Islam in early modern Spain. He is the author of *The Sacrament of Penance and Religious Life in Golden Age Spain* (The Pennsylvania State University, 2012) and *This Happened in My Presence: Moriscos, Old Christians, and the Spanish Inquisition in the Town of Deza, 1569-1611* (University of Toronto, 2017).
