#### Another Lindenwood Milestone...

Right now, it looks like we have a record number of students graduating in 1993. Preliminary numbers from the Registrar's Office indicate that about 724 students will be taking part in the May Commencement ceremonies; a total of approximately 750 students are graduating. A meeting will be set in late April or early May concerning faculty voting on the graduates.

#### **Unique Partnership**

Lindenwood College is involved in an exciting new educational-business partnership in St. Charles County. Lindenwood is teaming up with the Economic Development Council and the Small Business Synergy Corporation to provide the educational component of the new Synergy Center for Business Education. The Synergy Center is a small business incubator located at 5988 Mid Rivers Mall Drive in St. Peters. Governor Mel Carnahan will cut the ribbon at the Center's grand opening, set for Friday, March 12.

Beginning April 3, Lindenwood will offer undergraduate and graduate business courses at the Center. LC will have offices and classrooms, along with an administrator on-site. This partnership gives LC business students a unique opportunity to gain valuable hands-on experience with area businesses that are just starting up. Besides offering these courses, LC will also provide seminars, training workshops, conferences, and special classes tailored to individual business needs.

Judi Stotlemeyer is the new Director of Business Programs for Lindenwood College at the Synergy Center. Judi will be the liasion between the College and area businesses to determine their needs, and how LC can meet them. Once the Center is open, Judi will have an office there, although she'll be on the main campus at times. Welcome aboard, Judi!

#### **New Lion Home**

The LC Board of Directors has approved plans to break ground on a 3000-seat gymnasium this summer. The new gym will be home to the Lion basketball, volleyball and wrestling teams. President Dennis Spellmann also unveiled plans for a regional amateur athletic convention center which would house the only indoor 8-lane banked track in the state. A leading sports architect has designed the center, which would be located on Lindenwood land adjacent to the new gym. So far, City and county leaders are supporting the proposal, which would help make St. Charles County a cultural and entertainment center.

### **Education Approval**

Congratulations to the Education Department, which received State Board of Education approval for all LC's 21 professional education programs. The College received approval for the maximum time allowed -- 5 years. Again, congratulations to everyone in the Education Department for this fine achievement!
