Lindenwood Wireless Improvements



Over the summer break, Lindenwood IT has made some improvements to the wireless network in the Academic buildings on the St. Charles and Belleville Campuses. The most noticeable change is a reduction in the number of wireless SSIDs visible on campus. Both the Lindenwood-Student SSIDs

have been removed. Everyone can now simply use the <u>Lindenwood</u> SSID and connect using your same Lindenwood Login to access the wireless network.

The <u>Lindenwood-Guest</u> SSID has also been upgraded to simplify access by removing the need to enter a username and password. You can now join this network, agree to the 'Acceptable Use Policy" and will have access to the wireless network and internet.

Parking on Watson Street to be Restricted at Start of Semester

Due to a water project by the City of St. Charles northeast of the St. Charles campus, parking on Watson Street will remain restricted at the start of the semester until that portion of the project is completed. All students and employees are encouraged to give themselves extra time in the morning to find available parking. Nearby lots include the Roemer Hall and Harmon Hall lots and the parking lot of the Presbyterian Church at Sibley and Gamble Streets.
