18 Inst. all the goods have gone or are going from here in a day or two. Mr. Branaugh goes to Philad^a tomorrow. goods can now be had there and the small articles having been just up here, he will not be long in dispatching the waggons from thence. he will attend to the ----- and other matters about which you have written: Mr. Johnson's letter to move goes on today he will be with you soon you will hurry on your boat and his to completion as soon as possible and remain at Brownsville for further instructions which will be in a few days
