## **Anthropology Speaker Series Talks This Week**



As part of our grant project through the Missouri Humanities Council, and in cooperation with the National Park Service Submerged Resources Center, the Archaeology Laboratory and Department of Anthropology is presenting several lectures associated with our underwater survey for the wreck of *Far West* in the Missouri River. She sank in 1883, but is best known for transporting the US Army wounded survivors from the Battle of the Little Bighorn to Fort Abraham Lincoln, near present day Mandan, North Dakota in 1876. She sank

approximately five miles below St. Charles in the Missouri River. Read more
