## **Phonathon Rings a Bell**

The 1989 Lindenwood College Alumni Phonathon is wrapped up for the year--and according to Alumni Relations and Giving Director **Judy Peters**--it's a big success. The phonathon raised \$210,897.70 this year. The original goal was \$190,000, so the phonathon met 110% of its goal. This year's top phonathon caller is **Cindy Fehmel**, who solicited more than \$32,000 in funds. Top volunteer caller is Alumni Association President **Maurita Stueck** who raised nearly \$8000 in pledges from fellow alumni. This year's fund raising effort brought in more pledges and money than the 1988 campaign. A big round of applause to Judy Peters, call leader **Donna Ziegemeier**, and the 37 callers. #### **Grant Given**

The Arts and Education Council has awarded grants totaling \$322,389 to its member organizations. The grant money comes from the A & E's CAMELOT/Special Projects Fund. The grants, ranging from \$15,000 to \$500 were awarded to 67 organizations to support arts and arts education activities in the greater St. Louis area. Lindenwood College is the recipient of one of those grants. A & E gives the grants to produce a variety of concerts, plays, exhibits and educational activities.

#### Faculty Recital

Recently, three music faculty members from Lindenwood gave a concert of "Music for Winds and Organ" at the St. Charles Presbyterian Church. The recital was held Sunday, June 25.
