Holocaust Survivor To Speak

Students, faculty and staff are invited to an LCIE colloquium given by Holocaust survivor Hedy Epstein. She will speak Wednesday, November 9 at 7:00 p.m. in Jelkyl Theatre. Epstein survived the holocaust by being sent on a Children's Transport from Germany to England in 1939. Her parents and other family members were deported to camps and subsequently perished either on their way to or in Auschwitz. After the war, Epstein worked as a research analyst at the Nuremberg Trials of the physicans who performed medical experiments on concentration camp inmates. Epstein, who now lives in St. Louis, gives lectures and slide presentations to schools, colleges, churches and other organizations all over the world. What a way to start the season! The Lindenwood College Lions wrestling team is ranked number one in the nation in the recent NAIA pre-season poll. Head Coach Stacy Weiland, four All-Americans and four national meet qualifiers are returning to lead the pack in its fourth season. Last year, the Lions finished fourth in the nation in the NAIA. Weiland was named runner-up "Rookie Coach of the Year" by the Amateur Wrestling News last season in a ranking that included coaches from NCAA Division I Schools. The Lions open the season November 4 at the Iowa State (Ames) University Open.

Congratulations are also in order for Coach Tim Champion, Assistant Coach John Guffey and members of the women's soccer team. They are ranked number 11 nationally.

Lions Football Takes Heart

The Lindenwood Lions football team has been officially invited to join the Heart of America Conference, beginning in the fall of 1996. This conference consists of other NAIA colleges in Missouri, including William Jewell, Culver-Stockton and Missouri Valley, as well as a couple of schools in Iowa and Kansas. Head Coach Jeff Driskill says that's good news for our team and student-athletes. "We'll be taking shorter trips and playing colleges with more local name recognition. We're thrilled to be asked to play in a league that's rich in football tradition." Currently, the Lions are members of the Mid-States Football Association, a new conference. The Lions played as an independent team for its first five years.
