NCAA Weekend Sports Action

The Lindenwood women's volleyball team will host two MIAA games this weekend. On Friday at 7 p.m., the Lady Lions will take on Missouri Southern. The next day, Lindenwood hosts Southwest Baptist at 2 p.m. Lindenwood has won two straight conference matches, including an upset win over Washburn last Saturday. Missouri Southern is tied with the Lady Lions in the conference standings, while Southwest Baptist is just 1-4 in MIAA action.

The women's soccer team will face Northeastern State on Saturday night at 7 p.m., and it will then host Central Oklahoma on Sunday at 2 p.m. Northeastern State is a perfect 9-0-0 on the season, while Central Oklahoma is 5-4-1 overall. The Lady Lions are coming off an exciting win on Sunday when they scored the game-winner against Nebraska-Kearney less than a minute into the overtime period.

The men's soccer team has a crucial game on Sunday against Fort Hays State at 11 a.m. Lindenwood won last year's MIAA regular season championship, while Fort Hays State won the NCAA regional title. Both teams are looking for a win to improve their chances to win this year's conference title and have a leg up in making the NCAA Tournament field.

Cote Paper Accepted by Two Journals

"Vision of Effective Leadership" by Dr. Bob Cote, program director of management in the School of Accelerated Degree Programs, has been accepted by the *Journal of Leadership, Accountability and Ethics*, and the *International Journal of Business Administration*.

The purpose of the paper will be to develop a framework for the objective evaluation of leadership styles, including effective and dark side leadership. In the framework, various leadership approaches are identified, such as (1) Transformational Leadership, (2) Transactional Leadership, (3) Charismatic Leadership, (4) Situational Leadership, (5) Pseudo-Transformational Leadership. Using this framework, two historical leaders will be compared and contrasted according to their leadership style. In the final section, dark side leadership dimensions will be reviewed and evaluated. Based on the framework, a vision of leadership strategy plan will be completed for incorporating effective leadership, including recognizing darker characteristics and providing solutions to avoid the emergence of dark leadership.

Walton Publishes on US Foreign Policy

Dale Walton, associate professor of international relations in the School of Humanities on Lindenwood University's St. Charles campus, recently published a think-piece on US foreign policy. The essay was published online by *Modern Diplomacy*, "a leading European opinion-maker." Walton argues that "Washington unwittingly has been crafting a bipartisan, slow-motion global policy disaster for years, and the results of its policy failures simply are becoming too difficult to ignore."
