p.m. at Hunter Stadium. The Lions will be taking on Emporia State, a top-four team in the national preseason polls.

Other home events this weekend include the women's hockey team starting league play on Friday and Saturday. The Lady Lions take on Mercyhurst at 3 p.m. on Friday, and 10:30 a.m. on Saturday. The contests will be a rematch of last year's first-round conference tournament match, which was won by Lindenwood.

The women's soccer team hosts Washburn on Friday evening at 7 p.m., and Emporia State on Sunday at 11 a.m. Both teams are just ahead of Lindenwood in the conference standings.

The biggest event of the weekend will be the final one on Sunday when field hockey takes on nationally-ranked Limestone at 2 p.m. A win by the Lady Lions would move them into a tie in the loss column in the ECAC standings.
