Lindenwood will host the Missouri Valley Division Championships this weekend at the St. Peters RecPlex. This is our only home tournament this season. We are playing for our sixth consecutive Division

title and the winner qualifies for the Collegiate Water Polo Association National Championships at Florida State University Nov. 10-12.

Lindenwood is the only team in history to win three consecutive National Championships, in 2014,2015, and 2016.
