Rec'd 16 and Ans'd 18th by Paul Loesi by whom sent two Horses, one a Black belonging to Adams, the other a Dun, belonging to Maurice, both recovered from Osages.

Saint Louis May 12th 1818

D. Sir

Your favor of the 28th ulto I had the pleasure of receiving a few days ago- By Paul you will receive a medal for Tallow Back.

Sence my return Mrs. Clark has been, and continues so dangerously ill that I can only absent myself from her a fiew minets at
a time, which prevents my writing you a more lengthy letter at this
time- A Bill has passed both houses of Congress for the admission
of Illinois as a State, and a Bill has progressed to a Second reading for the admission of Missouri- I think it more than probable that
we Shall have a War with Spain-

It is the wish of government that a good understanding Shall be brought about between the Osage & Cherokees, for that purpose I Shall find employment for Paul Louis, if you can Spear him please to Send him down as Soon as possible. The Governmt. has ordered establishments to be made high up the Missouri, for that purpose 500 men is placed in requisition to move this Summer

A principal Indian Agent will also be appointed for the Missouri Tribes & will ascend this year, I do not know the man to be Selected, as the appointment is not yet made- please to inform me of Such important occurences as may have come to your knowledge or information lately relative to Indian affairs-

Please to make my Compliments acceptable to Mrs. Sibley and accept the assurance of my highest respect and esteem
