Wrestlers Rank In Nationals

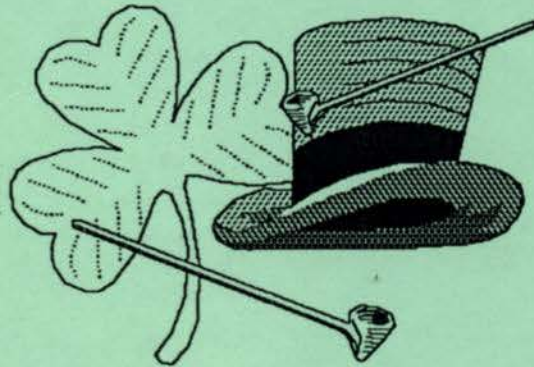
