Lindenwood will host four NCAA athletic events on campus this weekend. Highlighting the games will be the football team returning home on Saturday for a 1 p.m. game against Nebraska-Kearney. The Lions are looking to finish the season strong, starting with the game against a Lopers team that they beat by 21

points last year on the road.



The Lady Lions field hockey team will end the regular season with two home games this weekend. Lindenwood hosts Belmont Abbey on Friday at 5 p.m., followed by a Sunday noon game against Newberry. If the team wins both contest, it will finish in a first-place tie in the regular season ECAC field hockey standings.

Also on Friday, the women's soccer program will have its final home game of the year. Lindenwood takes on the No. 1 team in the country, Central Missouri, at 7:30 p.m.



The Library at The LARC would like to announce that we have been given a 30-day trial of Factiva (October 25, 2017 – November 24, 2017).


