- 2) In the search box enter "change my photo".
- 3) In the search results click the "change my photo" link.
- 4) Drag the new photo to the "drop file here" section.
 - a. Please make sure, the image is...
 - i. Less than 1 MB (only photos smaller than 1MB are allowed to be copied to the website directory)
 - ii. A .jpg file type
 - iii. Please upload a professional photo Your photo should be a portrait style image of you, and only you. Do not include objects, pets, or children. Avoid busy backgrounds as well.
- 5) Click the Submit button.
- 6) The photo will then be routed for approval by Human Resources.
- 7) Approved photos will then display in Workday immediately and will be copied to the website directory during the next scheduled time.


