Dr. Sir,

Our friend T. Morris writes me that he is on his way to Alabama, with a drove of Horses for Sale, and that he will not be back 'till in June or July next- He does not inform me however, what you are driving at- only that you are at my old place yet, and expect to Remain there- I would like very well to hear from you- What success in your new undertaking?- What your prospects?- Are you married, or soon likely to be?- & & &

I hope it may Suit you to Remain at the old place, so long as I own it- and that you will take some pains to keep it together, and in Repair- I ask no other Rent-

You owe me a Small Sum, for what you purchased in November 1828, payable nearly a year ago- I presume you are not at present very flush of money- if Such Should be the case, you may Rest easy about the little account- you can pay it at Some more convenient time- and you must be your own Judge when that time arrives- give yourself no further trouble about it- Let me hear from you, Send your letter to the Lexington Post Office, where I direct this.
