Belleville Dean of Students, Angela Wingo, Passes Away

Dear Lindenwood Family,

It is with great sadness that I let you know of the passing of Dr. Angela Wingo. Angela has been the Dean of Students at Lindenwood University-Belleville since June 1, 2010. During that time, she has cared for and guided our students through a period of unprecedented growth and change. Her creativity, intelligence, and passion were an essential part of making our campus what it is today. I remember early this year when Angela asked to meet with me and shared the seriousness of the health issues she was facing. I asked how we (the Lindenwood community) could help her through this fight. She asked only that we treat her the exact same and allow her to work as normal. She explained that she found comfort in her work and that she wanted to be there for our students. Over time, the effects of her illness took an obvious physical toll, yet she refused to give an inch as she pushed through with uncommon courage and commitment. Her faith was so strong that, even toward the end, you believed that she just might beat this illness. Today, our Lindenwood family has lost a very important member who will always be remembered as one of the "originals" whose vision and commitment to the possibility of a great university helped shape what we are today. Angela was also a mother, a wife, and a daughter. Our deepest condolences are with her children Taylor and Jordan, her husband Rob, and her parents Mel and Linda Bickel. Let our prayers be with them today as they hurt for the loss of such a special person. Further details will follow as they become available.

Morris Speaks at Yale University School of Management

Ed Morris, current professor and former dean of the Robert W. Plaster School of Business & Entrepreneurship, took part in a colloquium on asset management Wednesday, Oct. 26, at Yale University's School of Management. Morris was invited in connection with his 2015 book *Wall Streeters: The Creators and Corruptors of American Finance*. Morris said one of the 13 individuals he profiled in the book was William Donaldson, the founder of the investment banking firm of Donaldson Lufkin Jenrette and a former chair of the Securities and Exchange Commission. Donaldson was also the founding dean of Yale's School of Management and suggested to the current dean that Morris be invited to speak. Donaldson was also on the panel with Morris at the colloquium. Morris signed copies of his book following the event.

Honors Society Donates \$5,000 to Library Campaign (STC)



Alpha Chi Pi, a national honor society for Lindenwood University students with the top 10 percent GPAs, donated \$5,000 to the Doors to the Future campaign for the Library and Academic Resources Center. The society, which consists of junior, senior, and graduate students from all disciplines, will receive naming rights to one of the study spaces in the new building.

Alpha Chi initially pledged the donation in May and officially transferred the money to the campaign on Oct. 19.

"We were so excited to fulfill our pledge," said Lynda Leavitt, associate professor of education and Alpha Chi Pi advisor. "Our organization really wanted to support the university and leave a lasting mark for the future."

Alpha Chi presented an over-sized check to Lindenwood University System President Michael Shonrock during its induction ceremony on Oct. 19 in the Spellmann Center's Anheuser-Busch Leadership Room.

Big Weekend of Soccer and Field Hockey Action

The Lindenwood men's soccer team can claim a share of the MIAA Championship on Saturday at Hunter Stadium when it hosts Upper Iowa at noon. With a victory, the Lions will capture the third conference championship in just their fifth season in the league. The Lions enter the contest with an 11-2-2 overall record, and they are 6-0 in conference play. Upper Iowa is 6-8-0 overall and 3-3-0 in the MIAA. Earlier this season, Lindenwood defeated Upper Iowa on the road by a 4-2 margin.

The Lindenwood field hockey and women's soccer teams both end their regular seasons at home this weekend. The field hockey team plays Concordia (Wis.) on Friday at 3 p.m., followed by a Saturday contest at 3:30 p.m. versus Bellarmine. The women's soccer squad plays Northwest Missouri on Saturday at 1:30 p.m.

The field hockey team can clinch the top seed in the upcoming ECAC Tournament with a win on Saturday against Bellarmine. That battle will be between the top two teams in the conference. Earlier this year, the Lady Lions won the first meeting by a 3-1 margin. Lindenwood set a new school record for wins last weekend, and enters the game with a 12-3 record.

The women's soccer team enters the final week of the season in line for a MIAA Tournament bid and possibly a spot in the NCAA Tournament. Prior to Friday's away match against first-place Central Missouri, the Lady Lions are 8-6-1 on the year, while Northwest Missouri is 4-10-1. The tie for both teams came in a 1-1 match in a non-conference game between each other earlier this season.

Admission is free for all Lindenwood faculty and staff.

German High School Students Visit Lindenwood (STC)



A group of 21 high school students from Ludwigsburg, the German sister city of St. Charles, visited Lindenwood University for a tour and a luncheon on Oct. 24. Joe Daues, president of the St. Charles Sister Cities Program, and Mary Johnson, a Sister Cities member and parent of a Lindenwood student, accompanied the group.

The students arrived at the Scheidegger Center at 11 a.m. and met with Dr. Ryan Guffey, vice president for student development and global affairs, and German international student Max Bihler. After a tour through the facility, the group also visited the Spellmann Center, where they were welcomed by the staff of the Office of International Students and Scholars, who explained the different programs and opportunities for international students.

The German students lunched with Lindenwood University System President Michael Shonrock at Evans Commons, followed by a tour of the heritage campus led by Lindenwood's student ambassadors.

The two teachers from the high school in Ludwigsburg who accompanied the students, Mathias Schmidt and Sylvie Bühl, said their students liked the various facilities and programs that Lindenwood is offering its students outside of the classroom, which is not as common to such a degree at German universities. Some students also said that they are definitely considering coming back to Lindenwood as college students after they graduate high school in Germany.
