## IT Announcement – Workday System Scheduled Outage

Outage timeframe:

Wednesday, Nov. 23 at 6 p.m. – Saturday, Nov. 26 at noon

Saturday, Nov. 26 at 5 p.m. – Saturday, Nov. 26 at midnight

Workday will be unavailable during the Thanksgiving Holiday as we are implementing new functionality in our current Workday system. On Wednesday, Nov. 23, 2016, Lindenwood will begin performing an implementation to add Workday Student Recruiting and Admissions features to the Workday system. During the outage windows, all features of the Workday system, including time tracking, will be inaccessible via Internet Browsers and the Mobile App.

Access to all other IT services, including the website, network, wifi, Canvas, CAMS, the portals and email will be unaffected by this outage. The update to Workday will be completed by Saturday Nov. 26, 2016 at midnight. Employees that will be working during the outage windows will need to track their time manually and those hours will need to be entered into the Workday system by their manager when Workday is back in service. A brief window will be available on Saturday, Nov. 26, 2016 from noon to 5 p.m. to use

the Workday system for any employees that will need to track time. A reminder from Payroll is that all hourly employees must have their timecards submitted and approved by Monday, Nov. 28, 2016 at noon.
