Beuster serves as Assistant Baseball Coach in charge of pitching. He earned an undergraduate degree in 2008 from Culver-Stockton College, where he also played baseball under Doug Bletcher, who is now Lindenwood's head coach.

After graduation, Beuster earned a graduate degree in education from Lindenwood while serving as a graduate assistant and pitching coach. He then worked for two years as an assistant baseball coach at Bryon College in Dayton, Tenn., before accepting his current position.

"I'm looking forward to developing a top Division II baseball program at Lindenwood," Beuster said. "Nineteen of our 36 players are freshman, so it's going to be a unique and exciting challenge to see what this class can do."

Goerlitz, Head Gymnastics Coach, is a native of Wisconsin. She earned an undergraduate degree in cognitive neuroscience in 2007 from the University of Denver and then coached gymnastics for one summer in Bermuda.

She earned a master's degree in exercise physiology in 2009 from Texas Woman's University before working as the head gymnastics coach at Centenary College of Louisiana. There, she gained valuable experience in building a school program that helped prepare her for her role at Lindenwood.

"Right now, I'm recruiting and working on putting the program together," said Goerlitz. "I have a couple of girls to train with this year and we are shooting to have a full team by next fall. We will begin competing in 2013."

Knaebel is the new assistant softball coach. He served as a part-time coach last year and as an assistant softball coach from 2009-2010 at Saint Louis University. Originally from Jefferson City, he has been involving in coaching for many years.

"Instead of going on to play after graduation, I took a scholarship to coach at Lincoln University near my hometown and just ran with it from there," Knaebel said. "I share with Lindenwood the desire to compete for a national championship and create a top 25-program."
