St. Louis

Arrow Rock Dec. 7. 1813.

Sir,

I have caused to be delivered up & now have at my conmand in this neighborhood, a certain roan gelding which was stolen from Ft. Clark in June last, by an Indian of the Kansas Nation, which Horse is yours -- He is at present extremely lean in consequence of hard usage among the Indians, but I do not think he has lost his Spirit at all -- I have directed him to be well fed and attended to till he recovers his flesh -- the expense of which I Shall compel the Kansas to defray -- If no accident happens you Have him before Spring, I hope you will then receive him nearly if not quite as valuable as when you lost him --

In the mean time he is at your command free of any

expense whatever --
