Basketball Teams Begin Conference Play On Thursday Night

The Lindenwood basketball teams will both begin conference play on Thursday night with a doubleheader against Pittsburg State. The women's game will start at 5:30 p.m., followed by the men's game at approximately 7:30 p.m. The women's contest will be a tough task as the young Lady Lions team takes on a Pittsburg State squad that is undefeated on the season and ranked fourth in the country. The men's game will be a rematch between two teams that met in the first round of last year's MIAA Tournament.

Admission to both games is free for all Lindenwood faculty and staff.

Request for Computer Science Projects

As the primary part of a Computer Science course (CSC43000 - Senior Projects) that I will be teaching this Spring, students are required to work on a "real world" group programming project. In order to facilitate this, I would like to gather several potential projects from campus sources. So, if you have a potential computer programming project, I'd like to hear about it. Some things to keep in mind:

- 1) These would be student run projects, so there's no guarantee that the resulting program will work for you (or at all). In other words, don't suggest something that is "mission critical" in any sense of the phrase.
- 2) Anything that involves significant personal or other security related data is not a good idea.
- 3) Students will be getting college credit for this, so there is no need to pay anyone any money.
- 4) You'll need to meet with students occasionally (at some points frequently) as the semester progresses. Please keep this in mind!

As some project size guidelines, CAMS is essentially a programming project, but is FAR too large in scope to work with as a whole; however an individual module or two to "add in" to CAMS might be OK. Of course, security is a big issue with CAMS, so such a project would likely not be possible for other reasons. A project that simply keeps track of ticket sales is likely too small, but a project that kept track of open auditorium seats/locations, assisted with ticket sales, and kept track of actual ticket redemption (i.e. attendance) could potentially work.

I'll start deciding what projects to use in the class at the start of the Spring semester, so please bounce any idea(s) you may have off of me by Monday Jan. 9, 2017 (preferably sooner). You can reach me, Stephen Blythe, at sblythe@lindenwood.edu.
