Johnson Selected as September Employee of the Month

Lindenwood University Maintenance Department employee Steve Johnson has been named the Employee of the Month for September. The Wentzville, Mo., resident has been in the position since November 2009, prior to which he worked for 30 years as a Schnuck's warehouseman.

Johnson is currently responsible for overseeing maintenance issues in four male dorms on the St. Charles campus, including Pfremmer Hall, Dorm G, Matthews Hall, and Flowers Hall. He has established a solid rapport with residents and instituted a special way to keep the lines of communication open between himself and the students.

"I put a sheet of paper up in each dorm where the guys know where to find it," Johnson said. "They write on it what they need fixed, their phone number, and their room number, and I check it regularly to make sure I get to it as quickly as I can. Of course if it's urgent they can call, but the sheets seems to work great for everyday fixes."

Johnson's streamlining efforts and friendly attitude have had a positive impact on those he serves, particularly Sam Howarth, Resident Director of Dorm G.

"There haven't been any issues this semester that have taken Steve more than 24 hours to resolve," Howarth wrote in his nomination letter on Johnson's behalf. "He has been kind and polite every time I have seen him, and he has always done more than necessary to ensure residents don't have to deal with maintenance issues for long," he continued.

"There have been numerous students who've passed on positive comments about him, and I know that my dorm has been able to operate smoothly thanks to Steve's hard work and proactive attitude in doing whatever needs to be done to resolve issues quickly."

As for Johnson, he returned praise to the students when he learned he'd been named Employee of the Month.

"Even though I didn't know who it was at the time, I thanked all the boys for nominating me. I think it's great that they thought to do something like that."
