F. Osage Jan. 22d 1818.

This day Mo-no-soo-jee a Man of the G. Osage Nation put into my hands a paper which he Says was presented to him last Summer in Canada, whither he and Several other Indians of the Osage and Kansas Tribes had gone on a visit by particular invitations - The following is a literal Copy of Said Paper

"To the chiefs & Warriors of the Osage, Maiwatees

"& Canssan Nations inhabiting west Side of the Missouri River:

"Brothers -- I have the Satisfaction to congratulate you and

"all your Neighboring Nation to the Setting Sun -- I had en"deavour'd this few years back to disperse the heavy Cloud
"which was pondering over your Villages -- My endeavours was
"not neglected by the Great Spirit above -- As I have the
"Gratification to announce to all the western nations Nations -"That I have Succeeded in that grand object of uniting all
"Nations together.

"Brothers -- My advice to you is, never to interfere "in point of Political View where white People are concern'd.

"Hold fast your lands, dont Suffer yourselves to be
"Deluded by the Bright Metal to induce you to part with Land
"where you hunt to maintain your Women and Children -- endeav"our to be on the most friendly terms with the Traders who will
"venture to your Country.-- I hope the Great Spirit of life will
"always Protect you and your Red Brothers who resides at the
"Rising of the Sun, that you may all travel on the Road of Tran"quility & Peace and be Strong in your Mind. -- Dont be per"suaded by the White People to take hold of the War Club as
"your Brothers have experienced in this country very much in"jured themselves themselves by embracing the War Club."

"Adieu Brothers, Remember me when you are at home -"I am a half Indian & a friend to all Indian Nations.

"Once belonging to his Brittanic Majesty Service in the late
"Indian Department. Upper Canada Amherstburg 8th August 1817.

Which paper I returned to the Indian with the following endorsed thereon.

F. Osage 22. Jan. 1818.

"I have taken a literal copy of this address to be transmitted "to the Gov." In the mean time I must warn the Red People of the "Missouri to be extremely cautious how they make visits to the "British or Spanish Authorities, they Cannot possibly be pro-"ductive of any good, tho' they may produce very evil effects to "the Indians -- The above address is not by any means to be regarded as coming from a Source entitled to any particular respect -- It ought more properly to be considered as an idle and meddling interference in their Affairs on the part of a foreigner who has no Right of intercourse with them except by permission of the President of the United States.

Quantity of Whiskey Licenced Miscellaneous Remarks Memorandum of a preliminary arrangement (for the purchase and Sale of Lands) made on the 30th day of Sep^t 1818 at Fort Osage, between G. C. Sibley S. Ag^t of Ind. Affairs for the U. States, acting in this matter under Instruction from His Exc. Gov. Clark, on the one part, and the Chiefs and Head Men of the Kansas Nation on the other part --

Proposition by G. C. Sibley -- The Governor has directed me to inquire of the Chiefs and Head Men of the Kansas Nation, whether they are willing to Sell a portion of their Lands to the United States? and if they are, to know of them the extent of the Tract they will Sell, and the Terms? --

The Said Chiefs and Warriors having had the above proposition under their consideration for two days and having consulted with nearly all the principal persons of their Nation (who are also here present) and have themselves heard the proposition; now come forward freely without the least persuasion or compulsion, in the presence of nearly the whole of their nation, and of many respectable white Persons, and Say,

as the bounds of the Territory which they will Sell to wit -- Beginning at the mouth of the Nodoway River on the Missouri, and from thence running in a direct course to the Mouth of the River La Plane, a branch of the Kansas River, thence thence due South to the Nee Osho River, thence direct to the most Southwardly head branch of the Tabo River, thence down Said Tabo to the Missouri, thence with the Missouri up to the beginning -- All the right, title and claim which they the Said Mansas Nation have to the Territory embraced within the bounds above described (and

also all the lands they own or claim Northeast of the Missouri River) they will Sell and transfer to the U. States forever, on the following terms and conditions to Wit --

At the Signing and Sealing of the Treaty of Transfer of the above Territory, The U. States Shall pay to the Kansas Nation \$1000. in Suitable Merchandise at fair prices, and Annually in the month of September ever after, at Such place as Shall be agreed on, the United States Shall pay to the Said Nation the following articles, or an equivalent, in Cash or other merchandise at the option of Said Kansas, to Say -- 100 3 p. Bkts. -- 150 2 p. 150 l.p. D. -- 150 yds. Strouds Ass. -- 20 yds. Scarlet Cloth --200 yds. Callico Ass -- 20 lb. Vermillion, 40 Fusils -- 300 lb. Gunpowder -- 600 lb. Lead -- \$100 value in Wampum and Trinkets, \$150 value in Kettles, Hoes, Axes, Knives, Flints, Awls & Tobacco All the Said Merches to be of good quality and the Said Chiefs and Head Men in behalf of their Nation give Notice, that they Shall further Stipulate in the Treaty of transfer above mentioned, for the particular protection of the U. States and for their aid and Counsel in effecting Amelioration of their present condition -- A Blacksmith to mend and repair their Guns, Hoes, Axes &c., will be particularly Stipulated for.

In testimony of the above, the Said chiefs and Warriors have affixed their marks to this Mem. having a full and clear understanding thereof.
