## Jim Shoemake Elected Chair of American Horse Council

Lindenwood University Chairman of the Board Jim J. Shoemake was elected chairman of the Board of Trustees of the American Horse Council at the organization's annual meeting on June



26 in Washington, D.C. The AHC represents the horse industry before congress and federal regulatory agencies in Washington.

Shoemake has been on Lindenwood's Board of Directors since 1999 and is a senior partner in the St. Louis law firm of Guilfoil Petzall & Shoemake, L.L.C.
