**Gymnastics Home Finale Highlights Weekend Sporting Events** 

The Lindenwood gymnastics team takes on Texas Woman's on Sunday in a 1 p.m. dual meet at Hyland Arena. The Lions and Pioneers are the top two teams in the MIC, and are expected to be the favorites at next month's conference championships. The dual meet is the final home event of the season, and the team's four seniors will be honored during the event.

The Lindenwood softball team has its home opener on Saturday under first-year head coach Liz Kelly. The Lady Lions will play a 3 p.m. game against Wisconsin-Parkside on Saturday, followed by a 12 p.m. doubleheader on Sunday. The Lady Lions enter the contest with three wins already under their belts on the young season.

The No. 7 men's lacrosse team takes on Ohio Valley at Hunter Stadium on Saturday at 1 p.m. The Lions went into overtime with the top-ranked team in NCAA Division II last weekend, before falling 8-7. The Fighting Scots are 1-0 on the year.

Also at home this weekend is the men's volleyball team which takes on nationally-ranked Loyola Chicago on Saturday at 2 p.m. The Ramblers have won two of the last three NCAA Division I National Championships.

IT Announcement – Workday System Scheduled Outage

Workday outage timeframe:

Friday, March 10, 2017 at 8 p.m. – Wednesday, March 15, 2017 at 11:59 p.m.

Workday will be unavailable beginning March 10 at 8 p.m. to implement Workday Finance. During the outage timeframe, all features of the Workday system, including time tracking, will be unavailable via all Internet browsers and the mobile app.

Access to all other IT services, including the website, network, wifi, Canvas, CAMS, the portals and email will be unaffected by this outage. The update to Workday will be completed by Wednesday, March 15 at 11:59 p.m. Employees that will be working during the outage windows will need to track their time manually and those hours will need to be entered into the Workday system by their manager when Workday is back in service. Note that all hourly employees must have their timecards submitted and approved for that timecard by Monday, March 20, 2017 at noon.

We are sorry for the disruption in service during this implementation of the next feature in Workday.
