The tournament took place at Rimrock Auto Arena at MetraPark in Billings, Mont.

The No. 2 Lindenwood women's lacrosse team will play in the program's first doubleheader on Tuesday at Hunter Stadium. The Lady Lions enter the twin bill with a record of 6-0 and a perfect 3-0 mark from within the Rocky Mountain Athletic Conference (RMAC). Lindenwood will begin the action on March 21 with a 3:00 p.m. non-conference tilt versus the McKendree Bearcats, before hosting the Adams State Grizzlies at 7 p.m. for an RMAC clash.
