Employees Will Submit Requests for Sick Time Through Workday!

Effective April 1, 2017 all faculty and staff will request <u>sick time</u> through Workday. Sick time must be submitted *by the employee* prior to the time being taken.

The process for documenting the absence is the same as requesting a vacation day. Employees will note if the sick time is *regular* or *bereavement*. Both sick and vacation requests will go to the supervisor to approve.

Workday Outage Timeframe

Tuesday, April 4, 2017 at 5 p.m. – Wednesday, April 5, 2017 at 8 a.m.

Workday will be unavailable beginning April 4 at 5 p.m. to complete the implementation of Workday Finance. During the outage timeframe, all features of the Workday system, including time tracking, will be unavailable via all Internet browsers and the mobile app.

Access to all other IT services, including the website, network, wifi, Canvas, CAMS, the portals and email will be unaffected by this outage. The update to Workday will be completed by Wednesday, April 5 at 8 a.m. Employees that will be working during the outage windows will need to track their time

manually and those hours will need to be entered into the Workday system by their manager when Workday is back in service.

We are sorry for the disruption in service during this implementation of the next feature in Workday.

Belleville's Social and Behavioral Sciences Division Hosts Summit for Professional Women in Criminal Justice

The Social and Behavioral Sciences Division on the Belleville campus recently hosted a Criminal Justice Summit, featuring women in criminal justice professions.

Panelists answered questions from more than 100 students about being a woman building a career in criminal justice. The panel comprised women working for the FBI, the U.S. Attorney General's Office, the U.S. Marshall's Office, the Illinois State Police, the 20th Circuit Court, St. Clair County, the State's Attorney's Office, and a private practice law firm.

According to Dr. Thomas Trice, who organized the event, the goal was to not only highlight challenges that women can face within the field of criminal justice, but to also illustrate overcoming those challenges and building a successful career.
