Lindenwood shotgun sports has once again dominated the competition at ACUI Collegiate Clay Target National Championships, winning an incredible 14th consecutive national title. The competition consisted of six events over the course of five days at the National Shooting Complex in San Antonio, Texas. Over 800 athletes represented 85 different schools, and 45 elite competitors represented the Lions in all six events.
