Sir

I rec'd this morning yours of the 27th
by hands of Mr. Bullock - enclosing the recpt of
Miss Lanyay and guarantee of Mr. Mr. Bullock
you will please procure and forward me duplicates
of this paper of same date (27th Feb.)

I now enclose a check on the Branch
Bank in Baltimore to your order for £450, for £100
of which I have your recpt. in your answer for the
remaining £350 you will send me duplicate recpts
described as so much placed in advance in your
hands to buy goods by my order for which you are
to account & like recpts you will send me for the £300
sent you in sum of 26 Feb & dated on the day this last
mentioned sum came into your hands - much
occupation to day prevents me from advancing
now in the list of Purchases. I ^{have} some things to order
but considerably you will remark on the list
sent you on the 27th. that in some of the articles
as Flint Lead &c the quantity ordered is larger
than on the mem^r you took with you. This was
unintended and you will buy by the list then sent
as to quantity.

I thank you for the pieces of silver
more you have transmitted. They will be attended
in a few days - do you what Muskrat Traps
are I want about 120 of them. I think they are
imported. have only sprung and are shaped thus
 pray enquire and inform me - the clerk
of the Stage office being out of the way I have not
been able to see the Gun Locks sent me. more of
them in my next. you had as well send also
those last of Poulting & Thomas. respectf^r G^r
