Yours of the 11th 12th are
before me. I have paid all your Bills as
they have appeared, as soon as you have
completed the purchase of all the purchase
lists heretofore sent you as far as to be pro-
-ceed you may pack up and ship by the
first good vessel to this place (of which
you had best immediately enquire) & return
except as to a Bale of Blue cloth say 10 or
15 Pieces $7\frac{1}{4}$ to $6\frac{1}{4}$ wide with a white border
to cost from $\$1\frac{3}{4}$ to $\$2$ & you which if to be
had I wish yet to be added.

As to the Cow Bells it is not materi-
-al at present, if you succeed in the Beaver
Traps, send me one or two round as a sample
