I have to request that you will make out and forward your accounts for the quarter ending on the 30th Sept^r. next as early after the ~~next~~ expiration of the quarter as possible giving a full detail of the value and state of the property on hand as directed in my letter of 23rd Dec^r 1809 including the factors buildings and every thing appertaining thereto, as I may be called on shortly after the meeting of Congress to exhibit a statement of the fund of the Indian Trading House establishment - should your accounts be made out and sent off before this gets to hand, you will make out and forward immediately to this office such supplementary statement as under these instructions you may find necessary to give me the most correct information of the state of the factor under your charge -

as the Petties on hand will probably be injured in some measure by worms - and as the prices of the article are much depressed at present you will make such deduction at the bottom of the abstract of Petties on hand as you may deem necessary so as to show their amount to be no more than they are actually worth. -

[When any Goods for your own ^{use} are forwarded in future from this Office they be added at the bottom of the factory Invoices. you are immediately on receiving the Invoices to charge the amount with the advance to your account proper on the factory Books and account for them in your salary account as for other Goods received from the factory and appropriated to your own use -

In future you will please add up all your dispatches direct to me at Georgetown District of Columbia where my office is kept - J am 8-1-
