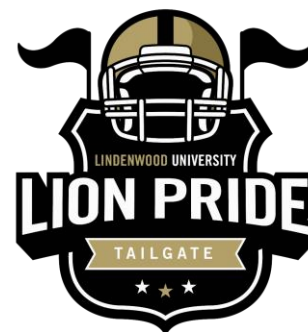

Four Week and First-Half Midterm Grade Deadlines

Four Week Grades

The deadline for four week full-length semester (undergrad only) courses are due Monday, September 19 at 5 p.m. The grade transfer from canvas to cams will occur on Tuesday, September 20. Please make sure to enter all special grades (I, AF, N) in the faculty portal by the deadline. The last day to withdraw from full-length semester courses is October 30, 2022. A student should receive an AF grade if they attended but then stopped attending before the withdraw deadline.

First-Half Midterm Grades

The deadline for midterm first half semester (undergrad only) courses is Monday, September 19 at 5 p.m. The grade transfer from canvas to cams will on occur on Tuesday, September 20. Please make sure to enter all special grades (I, AF, N) in the faculty portal by the deadline. The last day to withdraw with a W grade will be September 25, 2022. A student should receive an AF grade if he/she attended but then stopped attending before the withdraw deadline.

*** Grades that are entered in Canvas for individual assignments after the grade transfer will not be updated for the grade cams. ***

The Anthology Student Project has been progressing as expected. Lindenwood IT Enterprise Systems are currently preparing to send data to Anthology for the fourth round of testing, also called Spin 4. Once the data are received, the project team will begin the fourth round of data validation and process testing, leading into the User Acceptance Testing (UAT) phase. On October 28, Lindenwood Subject Matter Experts (SME's) and the Executive Steering Committee will meet with Anthology to assess our Go Live readiness. With a positive outcome, the project team will begin final preparations for production launch.

The Lindenwood Anthology Team is working diligently to provide a system that will serve our community. When asked what would be most beneficial to the Lindenwood Community with the rollout of Anthology Student, Kevin Manley stated:

“In seeing the development of Anthology student, I believe the dynamic advising tools will be invaluable to the university as we seek to reach the next level of Q2 service. Instead of spending hours maintaining Excel degree plans, researching transfer credit, and charting out “what-if” scenarios for students who want to change majors/minors, Anthology Student will allow us to spend more time fulfilling our calling—supporting our students. Through tools like Degree Planner, our student advising, and mentoring conversations will be less about Excel documents and courses and more about goal setting, success-planning, getting involved, etc. The system also offers robust student group features. For example, if someone has a group of first-generation, Pell-eligible students they wanted to keep close tabs on, they could create a group of those students and be able to call up the roster with just a few button clicks. I expect Anthology Student to revolutionize how we support our Lions and permit us the time and flexibility we need to offer the best-in-class service our students deserve.”

2022-23 RISE Awards and Fall Development Opportunities

The RISE Project offers two separate awards for the 2022-2023 academic year. There will be four recipients of the RISE Award: two full-time faculty members and two adjunct instructors. These awards will recognize faculty who have achieved excellence in implementing two of the RISE pillars in their courses.

The RISE Innovator Award will have one recipient, who may be either a full-time or adjunct faculty member. The RISE Innovator Award recognizes a faculty member who has demonstrated exceptional creativity, problem-solving, or innovation in implementing the RISE pillars in their courses. Applications for both awards will open in January 2023.

To be eligible to submit for these awards, full-time faculty need to complete four RISE trainings and adjunct faculty need to complete three RISE trainings throughout the academic year. Any workshops attended during Welcome Week count, as do any outside trainings (webinars, seminars, or conferences) that relate to the RISE pillars.
