Sukkah Building Event on Campus

On Friday, October 7 from 12 - 12:50 p.m., students enrolled in HIST3800 will construct a Sukkah on campus, with generous consultation from several Jewish students and local Rabbi Chaim Landa. A Sukkah is a temporary shelter erected each year for the duration of the one-week holiday, Sukkot. The temporary shelter will be constructed on the Spellmann patio, adjacent to the clock tower near the picnic tables.

Dr. Marcus Smith will use this activity to teach students about the cultural significance of this holiday and its rootedness in Jewish history. The structure will remain for one week, during which time the University's Jewish Student organization will provide educational fliers about its cultural significance.

Over the next several weeks, Lindenwood Subject Matter Experts (SMEs) will work closely with Anthology to design area-specific training plans and materials. The area-specific training plans and materials will enable current and future employees to be trained on their job-specific processes and procedures within Anthology. In addition, by familiarizing yourself with the general functionality of the system, you will be able to take questions to your area SME, which will adjust training plans and materials accordingly.

Data for Spin 4 was delivered to Anthology on Monday, September 26. Anthology and the Lindenwood project team will validate and test within the next week. Once Spin 4 testing is complete, User Acceptance Testing (UAT) will begin. The next six weeks will be extremely busy for the Lindenwood community as we prepare for Go Live.
