As our Go Live date draws closer, employees must log into **Anthology Academy** to view available training and familiarize themselves with the Anthology - Student Information System. The **Introduction to Anthology Student Course** is a great place to start. Over the next several weeks, Lindenwood Subject Matter Experts (SMEs) will work to design area-specific training plans and materials. The area-specific training plans and materials will enable current and future employees to be trained on their job-specific processes and procedures within Anthology. In addition, by familiarizing yourself with the general functionality of the system, you will be able to take questions to your area SME, which will adjust training plans and materials accordingly.

Once Spin 4 testing is complete, User Acceptance Testing (UAT) will begin. The next five weeks will be extremely busy for the Lindenwood community as we prepare for Go Live. Please take this time to prepare yourself as much as possible for the transition.

Full-Length Midterms & First Half Final Grade Deadlines

Full-Length Midterm Grades

Full-length semester (undergrad only) midterm grades are due Monday, October 17 at 5 p.m. The grade transfer from Canvas to Cams will occur on Tuesday, October 18. Please enter all special grades (I, AF, N) in the faculty portal by the deadline. The last day to withdraw from full-length semester courses is October 30. A student should receive an AF grade if they attended but then stopped attending before the withdraw deadline.

First Half Final Grades

The deadline for final first half semester grades is Monday, October 17 at 5 p.m. The grade transfer from Canvas to Cams will occur on Tuesday, October 18. Please enter all special grades (I, AF, N) in the faculty portal by the deadline. The last day to withdraw with a W grade was September 25. A student should receive an AF grade if he/she attended but then stopped attending before the withdraw deadline.

*** Grades that are entered in Canvas for individual assignments after the grade transfer will not be updated for the grade Cams. ***


