T-4 weeks and counting! We are currently four weeks from the shutdown of CAMS. CAMS will be moved into VIEW ONLY at 5 p.m. on Friday, November 11. Lindenwood Subject Matter Experts (SME's) are currently in Spin 4 Testing. Lindenwood will move into User Acceptance Testing (UAT) by Monday, October 24.

As our Go Live date draws closer, faculty and staff must log into Anthology Academy to view available training and familiarize themselves with the Anthology - Student Information System. The Introduction to Anthology Student Course is a great place to start. Over the next several weeks, Lindenwood Subject Matter Experts (SMEs) will work closely with Anthology to design area-specific training plans and materials. The area-specific training plans and materials will enable current and future employees to be trained on their job-specific processes and procedures within Anthology. In addition, by familiarizing yourself with the general functionality of the system, you will be able to take questions to your area SME, which will adjust training plans and materials accordingly. 
Melissa Bidinger
