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Faculty Instructions for Commencement Ceremonies

Faculty - Please see the instructions below if you are participating in the [commencement ceremonies](#) on December 10 at 10 a.m. or 3 p.m.

- Faculty should enter through the Hyland Arena entrance next to the VIP room – please see the [campus map](#) with nearby parking lots
- Faculty check-in will be located inside the VIP room - retrieve your name card for the line-up
- Proceed downstairs 20 minutes prior to the ceremony start time – we will have signs on the floor with numbers that correspond to the number on your card
- An Academic Services member will be in a blue gown and will assist faculty to stand in the correct line-up order
- We will have faculty on each side of the arena to perform the clap-in when students are entering the arena -
- A person in a blue gown will lead faculty to their seats after the students have been seated
- Faculty will proceed down the center aisle, turn left then right to the seats
- When the ceremony has concluded, the platform party will exit first then the faculty – a person in a blue gown will lead you out of the arena and up the stairs to the VIP room
- Doors open for students and guests 1.5 hours prior to the start time – faculty should arrive at least 1 hour prior to the start time

COEHS Earns CAEP Accreditation

The College of Education and Human Services is pleased to announce that its educator preparation programs (EPP), some 43 programs in all, at both the initial and advance levels have received full accreditation by the Council for the Accreditation of Educator Preparation (CAEP), considered the gold standard for EPP accreditation. We are particularly honored to be recognized, as one of the few colleges that received no Areas for Improvement (AFIs) or Stipulations. This is an especially noteworthy accomplishment given that this is the first time Lindenwood has attempted CAEP accreditation and addressed both the advanced and initial CAEP standards. This milestone would not have been possible however, without the insightful input and hard work of our faculty and staff along with that of faculty from across the colleges in partnership with our community stakeholders.



Fall 2022 Issue of the Journal of Educational Leadership in Action Available on Digital Commons

The Fall 2022 issue of the [Journal of Educational Leadership in Action](#) (ELA) is now available and provides research on health-related issues in education, including COVID-19, as well as varied research on leadership practices. This issue contributes perspectives on the health of Latinx populations, the pandemic's impact on principals' and counselors' self-efficacy, and teachers' perspectives of work-family responsibilities during remote teaching. Further, this issue presents innovative research in the field of leadership, specifically, a reflection from an administration on the collaboration of schools, leadership traits of senior student affairs officers, conceptualization of leadership of South Korean and United States faculty, and assessment of enrollment rates at a Nigerian university.
