## **Jane Cruse Named June's Employee of the Month**

Jane Cruse, Student Information System Data Integration Manager, has been selected as the Lindenwood University Employee of the Month for June.

Cruse is an alumna who earned a bachelor's degree in computer information systems from Lindenwood in 2009 and was hired into the Department of Information Technology immediately following graduation. She worked as a



programmer analyst in September of 2009 before the promotion to her current role in 2012.

Typically, Cruse's job duties include pulling content from Lindenwood's Comprehensive Academic Management System (CAMS) into Blackboard, the University's online learning management system.

"I love being able to help people, whether that's helping students or faculty members access information, troubleshooting, or providing training," Cruse said. "The job is a blessing, because it pulls on my past experience, but it also helps me grow."

Cruse was jointly nominated for the Employee of the Month Award by Jeanie Thies, PhD, Dean of Institutional Research and Associate Professor of Criminal Justice, and Patrick Walker, JD, Associate Professor of Nonprofit Administration. They both

praised her extensive knowledge about the Blackboard system and Lindenwood Online, as well as her positive attitude and problem-solving skills.

"Jane has consistently shown herself to be an outstanding source of support to students and faculty, and she is unfailingly helpful, courteous, and patient, even when she receives phone calls from frantic faculty members at 5 p.m. on a Friday afternoon," Cruse's nomination letter stated. "She's a knowledgeable, reliable, and efficient employee who's essential to helping our University keep abreast of the rapidly changing technological tools that have become increasingly important in higher education.

"Ms. Cruse sets the standard for what makes an exceptional employee through her professionalism, courtesy, breadth of knowledge, willingness to assist others, and upbeat spirit."

Cruse said she was flattered to learn she'd been named the Employee of the Month and expressed gratitude to her nominators, the selection committee, and her colleagues.

"This is a big honor," Cruse said. "I didn't see it coming. I'm grateful to all the faculty and staff I work with. They're all lovely people."

**Ruettgers Shares Teacher Prep Research** 

Dr. Mary Ruettgers, Assistant Professor of Teacher Education, shared her research in

a presentation titled *Preparing Graduates of Teacher Preparation Programs for the 21st Century Classroom* at the International Conference on Education in Chicago, Ill., which was held May 25-May 27, 2015.

Dr. Cynthia Bice, School of Education Dean, participated in panel discussions relating to teacher training in 2015.

According to Chicago ICE Organizing Committee Chair Cengiz Karatas the conference hosted educators from 21 countries. Paper and poster presenters from 11 countries shared research on to a rich variety of topics related to educator preparation, training, and professional development; technology integration; curriculum design; socio-economic barriers; and school leadership. The conference was an excellent opportunity to discuss the current state of education, as well as avenues to improve education globally.

According to Dr. Amanda Aldridge, coordinator of charter school sponsorship, Lindenwood University began sponsoring the Gateway Science Academy in 2010. GSA is managed by Concept Schools, a non-for-profit entity based in Chicago, Ill., which hosts the annual ICE conference. Since its inception, GSA has grown from one school to four, educating 1,172 students in grades K-11 in the 2014 school year. In 2016, GSA will have its first graduating class.
