Rains Appointed Vice President for Information Technology and Chief Information Officer

Rains is responsible for leading the Information Technology team in delivering relevant and well managed services to the faculty, staff, and students of Lindenwood. Rains will serve on the President's Cabinet and work with institutional leadership to ensure proper alignment between



technology, strategic and operational plans, and university strategic goals and objectives.

Previously, Rains served as vice president for information services/chief information officer at Cardinal Stritch University in Milwaukee, Wis., where in


2012 he was appointed the first chief transformation officer and was responsible for leading transformational institution change across university operations. Rains also served as the associate chief information officer for enterprise systems and project management at Emporia State University in Emporia, Kan.

Rains said his top priorities at Lindenwood are to

- 1. Implement IT service management and project management processes to ensure consistent high-quality delivery of IT services to the students, faculty, and staff at Lindenwood.
- 2. Implement an improved IT asset refresh model to ensure timely replenishment of computers, printers, and classroom technology.
- Implement a new enterprise software management strategy to effectively manage the business and academic workflow of the University.
- 4. Develop and implement a strong IT governance model to support improved collaboration in the IT investment prioritization/selection process.
- 5. Support institutional initiatives through project leadership and guidance: (1) WorkDay HCM, (2) branding/web presence redesign and (3) Library and Academic Resources Center (LARC) planning/build out.

"I am excited to lead the IT department in delivering relevant IT services to the Lindenwood community," Rains said. "Delivering robust and evolving IT capabilities is crucially important to the future of Lindenwood University. I am pleased to be a part of this exciting time in LU history!"

Bill Dill Named NAIA Athletic Trainer of the Year

Lindenwood Belleville former head athletic trainer Bill Dill has been named the NAIA Athletic Trainer of the Year, as announced on Tuesday by the National Association of Intercollegiate Athletics. Dill helmed the athletic training staff since the inception of the athletic program in 2009, and was given the task of building his own department. In just six years, Dill has taken this athletic training department and staff to heights unparalleled.



"I am honored to receive this award and know it could not have been achieved without the great staff of athletic trainers around me," Dill said. "We strive to be servants to our student-athletes and provide them the best care we possibly can. Additionally, the support of my wife has allowed me to serve the profession beyond my daily responsibilities. For that, I am indebted to her and forever grateful."

This year, Dill took a position to oversee the athletic training major at Lindenwood Belleville and no longer serves as the head athletic trainer, although he provides a support role to the entire department.

During his tenure, he and his athletic staff oversaw 36 varsity sports at Lindenwood Belleville. In 2015-16, the athletic training staff has taken over duties for men's and women's rugby and women's field hockey a year after the athletic department also added men's and women's ice hockey, as well as men's and women's swimming and diving.

Currently, Dill serves on three different committees in the athletic training community. He has served on the Illinois Athletic Trainers Association Region 4 since November 2014, and the NAIA-ATA Professional Education and Research Committee since July 2014. Additionally, he joined the newly formed NAIA Council for Student-Athletes, which was created in June 2015.
