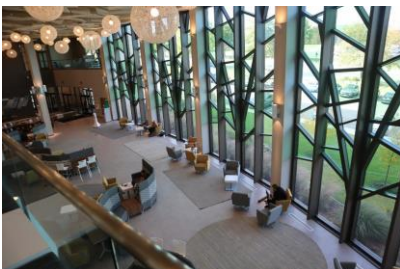

## **Adult Heartsaver CPR AED First Aid**

**This training is open to Lindenwood University faculty, adjunct faculty, staff, and students. There is a \$20/person cost to be certified.**

The Heartsaver Adult First Aid with CPR & AED course teaches how to manage illness, injuries, and cardiac arrest before professional help arrives. Content taught in the Heartsaver Adult First Aid with CPR & AED Course includes:

- General first aid principles
- Adult medical and injury emergencies
- Critical concepts of high-quality adult CPR
- Use of an automated external defibrillator (AED)
- Relief of choking for the adult

Successful completion of this course requires successfully demonstrating competency performing the following skills:

- Removing Protective Gloves
- Finding the Problem
- Using an Epinephrine Pen
- Controlling Bleeding and Bandaging
- 1 Rescuer Adult CPR (includes mouth to mask and AED use)
