In the theoretical session, I will share the definition of active and experiential learning concepts, application areas, short literature review about how they impact student learning and engagement, and follow up with a discussion. In the practical session, I will share resources and demonstrate how I use some of the active learning strategies in classroom, including collaborative and noncollaborative options. Examples may include Think-Pair-Share (TPS), Jigsaw, Gallery Walk, Minute Paper, Muddiest Point, Problem, Project-based and Service Learning. Examples come from the business analytics, project management, supply chain management courses but all areas of teaching are welcome to join the interactive workshop.
