## KCLC Joins Exclusive Music Chart

KCLC Radio has been added to Mediabase's Adult Alternative Activator Panel. KCLC already serves on both the Billboard Magazine Adult Alternative Monitored Panel and Jack Barton Entertainment (formerly FMBQ Magazine) Adult Alternative chart. However, Mediabase represents a more exclusive grouping of stations that measures listeners, as well as the number of times a record is played.

Representation on music charts is important. It indicates that KCLC is seen in the industry as a professional station that is staffed by college students. So, while gaining experience at KCLC, Lindenwood students are seen as peers of their professional counterparts, with their record spins being given equal weight to those of professionally staffed stations.

At KCLC, students receive real experience working in all departments of the radio station from daily interfacing with record labels, interviewing and recording sets from national touring artists, working as sportscasters around the region, and serving as DJ's on a major market, charted radio station, with a potential reach of more than 2.3 million.

We would like to thank everyone for their support and participation in the first LU Amazing Race Ability Edition! We had nine teams participate and 17 volunteers that helped make this event a success!



### Faculty, Staff, Family Members Needed for Research Study

Researchers in the Exercise and Performance Nutrition Laboratory are recruiting healthy, overweight and mildly obese men and women between 18 and 60 years of age to participate in a 12-week research study that seeks to examine the impact of adding supplementation with Beta-aminoisobutyric acid (BAIBA) to exercise on body composition, weight loss, glucose control, and cardiometabolic risk factors. You will be required to complete four visits to the lab, follow a daily walking program, and three days/week of resistance training sessions. Each lab visit will take approximately 60-90 minutes to complete. There is no cost to you for participating and cash compensation (\$300) will be provided. You must follow the prescribed workout program and communicate weekly with research staff to maintain eligibility.
