

Gettemeier June Employee of the Month

Jill Gettemeier, financial aid counselor, has been named the Employee of the Month for June. The St. Charles resident will celebrate her two-year anniversary of employment at Lindenwood on July 3.

Parisi Selected for Leadership Academy

Lindenwood wrestling head coach Joe Parisi was recently picked as one of 30 select wrestling coaches to attend the first-ever College Coaches Leadership Academy. Not only was he selected to attend, but he was named one of the event's "Legendary Coaches," which will give him an expanded mentor role at the academy.

The Leadership Academy was designed to help select coaches achieve success in the coaching profession. Parisi and the other coaches will participate in seminars dealing with topics such as leadership, goal setting, and building successful programs. It also provides the participants the opportunity to network with some of the top current and former coaches and administrators in collegiate wrestling.



The Leadership Academy will take place on Aug. 4-6 in Ft. Lauderdale, Fla. The event precedes the

National Wrestling Coaches Association Convention, which takes place from Aug. 6-9.

Parisi has been the head coach of the Lindenwood program for the last 10 years and has built the premier program in the NAIA. Among his many accomplishments over the last decade are five NAIA National Championships, two NAIA National Runner-Up, and three National Dual Championships.

Career Center Among Top 50 College Departments Using Twitter

Lindenwood University was included this month in an on-line blog post at www.job-hunt.org naming the "Top 50 College and University Career Centers Using Twitter." The list recognizes academic institutions across the nation who effectively use the networking tool in support of students and alumni.

Dana Wehrli, director of Career Services at Lindenwood, launched the department's Twitter account earlier this year under the username "@CareerCenter_LU." She has been largely responsible for expanding the account's network of "followers" and "tweeting" about professional development and career opportunities.

"This is due recognition for being a leading higher education enterprise," said James D. Evans, Ph.D., president of Lindenwood. "Great work!"

In addition to staying focused on employment information, the "@CareerCenter_LU" account also met several other criteria considered by job-hunt.org. The Twitter account is easily found when searched, the account name clearly represents Lindenwood's name and links to the school's website, the biography section indicates the purpose of the account, and the account is constantly active in posting relevant "tweets."

Lindenwood Partners with Little Guppy

Lindenwood University and Little Guppy Child Development Centers (LGCDC) have formed a partnership through which employees at each organization may be eligible for discounted services. LGCDC staff are offered tuition assistance options, while reduced child-care rates are offered to full-time Lindenwood employees and students.

Staff, faculty, and students at the university will not need to pay LGCDC's typical \$50 enrollment fee and will receive a 10 percent discount overall per child. The offer applies at both of the organization's two locations in St. Charles County: 1078 Bryan Road in O'Fallon, Mo., and 3151 Elm Point Industrial Drive in St. Charles, Mo.

"It's a win-win situation," said Joe Parisi, dean of day admissions. "This is a wonderful collaboration aimed at making it easier for both adults and their children to attend excellent educational organizations."
