Sir,

I am somewhat disappointed on my return from Louis-
to learn from Tracy Waterhouse that they have heard
nothing yet in relation to the balance due from the
Gov. to the West-Ind. Court, which you were to get
adjusted at Washington and place to the order of J. H. W.
for my use - As these Gentlemen are in advance
to me upon that score, and appear to be in
want of the money, I am extremely anxious that
it may be placed at their disposal as quickly as
possible - Will you have the goodness to advise
them as soon as you can conveniently after you
receive this, how the matter stands? -

I spent the winter quite agreeably with
my family in Louisiana, and returned to St. Louis
on the 10th of March - We are waiting here for the
Siberator to take us home; she will probably
arrive here by the 15th - I shall be at St. Louis
a few days next week - I have nothing of an
report; why is it not published? It surely ought to
be - Hope you will favour me with a letter
before long -
