Cincinnati June 29th, 1808.

I hereby engage & bind myself unto George C. Sibley to labor faithfully & diligently as an Oarsman on board of his Boat from this place to S. Louis in the Terry. of Louisiana to perform all the duties that a good Boatman is accustomed to perform & to continue with him until discharged— It being optional with the Said Sibley to discharge me or not at any time or place (between here & S. Louis) that he may think proper he Settling fairly & justly with me. It is also understood that I am to do the Cabin Cooking during the Voyage.—
