[Is the Constitution at a Crossroads?](#)

Join the Hammond Institute for Free Enterprise for this virtual and in-person discussion about the current state of the U.S. Constitution on Friday, September 15, from 6:30-8 p.m. at Vue 17, 1034 S. Brentwood Blvd., in St. Louis.

United States Court of Appeals Judge Douglas H. Ginsburg will explore whether the Constitution is still relevant in today's society and whether it needs to be amended to reflect modern values. Hammond Institute for Free Enterprise and Plaster College of Business and Entrepreneurship Economics Professor Dr. Howard Wall will moderate a discussion on recent Supreme Court decisions and their impact on civil liberties.
