Presentation on Global Tribunals Wednesday

Lindenwood University's Center for International and Global Studies (CIGS) will present the second speaker of its 2009-10 series lineup at 4 p.m. on Wednesday, Oct. 14, in the Anheuser-Busch Leadership Room of the Spellmann Campus Center. Brian Frederking, associate professor of Political Science at McKendree University, will discuss "Global Tribunals and International Criminal Law."

Frederking's research interests include collective security and the United Nations Security Council. His publications include articles in *American Political Science Review* and *International Studies Quarterly*. His most recent book is titled *The United States and the Security Council: Collective Security since the Cold War*. His research emphasizes global attempts to deal with terrorism, weapons proliferation, and human rights abuses.
