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Workday – HR Updates

The way employees apply to internal jobs is changing. *Career* is now being replaced with the *Jobs Hub*. The *Jobs Hub* allows employees to:

- Browse jobs
- View referrals
- Set up job alerts
- Apply and review application statuses

Navigating to the *Jobs Hub* is easy. Click on ‘Menu’ in the upper-left corner of your Workday screen and select *Jobs Hub*. You may need to use the scroll bar to find it on the list.

Attention Faculty: Change in PRIDE Fund Timeline

Starting Spring 2024, a new timeline will be followed for the PRIDE grant program. These changes are being made to better align with the University's fiscal year calendar. The new schedule is anticipated to better facilitate completion of a project within the same academic calendar, which should better facilitate recruitment of the same students into a given project.

To provide opportunity to any faculty who had intended to submit a [**PRIDE grant**](#) following the currently posted timeline, an abbreviated PRIDE grant program will be offered. Only projects with timelines that will be completed by June 30, 2024, will be considered. The timeline which will be followed is below:

- Application opens Monday, November 6
- Application deadline Friday, December 8
- Committee review Wednesday, December 13, through Friday, December 15
- Award notification Tuesday, January 16, 2024
- Funds available Tuesday, January 16, 2024
- Interim report Monday, April 1, 2024
- Project close Saturday, June 15, 2024
- Closure report Sunday, June 30, 2024

The new timeline that will be used in Spring 2024 semester and every semester thereafter is below:

- Application opens Monday, April 1
- Application deadline Tuesday, April 30
- Committee review Monday, May 13, through Wednesday, May 15
- Award notification Monday, June 3
- Funds available Monday, July 1
- Interim report 1 Sunday, November 3
- Interim report 2 Monday, March 3, 2025
- Project close Sunday, June 15, 2025
- Closure report Monday, June 30, 2025
