Sir

Your letters of the 21st & 28th January last with their enclosures have been received -

The Blankets & Strouds called for in your list of goods for the present year, will be forwarded in a day or two, to Pittsburg & the agent there for this office, will be directed to forward them to St. Louis as speedily as possible - There will be some other articles - say silver ware &c forwarded now with the Blankets & Strouds - The balance of the articles in your list will be forwarded in the course of the spring as far as they can be procured - The strouds & Blankets which we are now about to send you are of the very best quality - 3 pt. weigh upwards of 80 lbs per pair, & the small ones in proportion, the strouds fully 5/4 wide weigh 26 lbs per pt. of 20 full yds - By the enclosed statement you will see the cause of your draft in favor of Bosler & Co being protested -
