This Friday, December 8, is the last Free Lunch Friday of the fall semester.

The first **Free Lunch Friday** in 2024 is scheduled for Friday, January 12.

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Final Grades Instructions

Fall II 8-week and Fall 16-week final grades are due Monday, December 11 at 11:59 p.m.

The portal opened Monday, December 4, to allow instructors to enter special grades prior to the deadline.

We no longer are using the special grade pdf form. Instead, instructors will enter special grades (AF, N, I, AH, BH – see definitions below) in their faculty portal by the deadline. Instructors do not need to enter the traditional grades (A, B, C, D, F) in the portal, but they should ensure these grades are accurate in Canvas because the IT department will pull the traditional grades from Canvas and upload to Anthology on Tuesday, December 12. The letter grade of “D” is not an option to issue for graduate level courses.

Special Grade Definitions

- (AF) Attendance Failure – A student is given this grade if they stop attending a particular class prior to the published deadline to receive a grade of “W” but doesn’t officially withdraw from the course. The “W” deadline in the 2023-24 catalog for Fall II 8-week courses was November 19. The “W” deadline for Fall 16-week courses was October 29.
- (N) Never Attend – A student listed on the course roster but has never attended a class session or completed an academic activity, such as an assignment, quiz, test, paper, or discussion board post.
- Incomplete (I) – A grade is issued due to exceptional circumstances beyond the student’s control. The I must be resolved prior to the end of the subsequent term, or it will be changed to a F grade.
- (AH or BH) – A student seeking honors credit for a particular course.

Request for Campus Computer Science Projects in Spring 2024

As the primary part of a Computer Science course this spring, students are required to work on a "real world" group programming project. To facilitate this, potential projects from campus sources are needed. Some things to keep in mind:

- These are student-run projects, so there's no guarantee the resulting program will work for you (or at all). In other words, don't suggest something that is "mission critical" in any sense of the phrase.



Expect to end up with a “proof of concept” by the end of the semester, rather than a production level application.

- Anything that involves significant personal or other security-related data is not a good idea.
- Students will be getting college credit for this, so there is no need to pay anyone.
- You'll need to meet with students occasionally (at some points frequently) as the semester progresses.

As some project size guidelines, a Student Information System (CAMS, Anthology) is essentially a programming project, but is too large in scope to work with as a whole. However, an individual module or two to "add in" might be OK. Data privacy and security is a big issue with such systems, so a project would likely not be possible for other reasons. A project that simply keeps track of ticket sales is likely too small, but a project that kept track of open auditorium seats/locations, assisted with ticket sales, and kept track of actual ticket redemption (i.e. attendance) could potentially work.
