Charter Officials Help Dedicate New HD Studio

Lindenwood University's new high-definition television studio opened with a ceremony Monday honoring Charter Communications for its donation of \$250,000 to support the studio.

At the ceremony, Mike Wall, dean of the School of Communications, pointed out that the studio is one of the first high-definition television studios built from the ground up as such in the world. It is the second high-definition studio in operation in St. Louis, behind KSDK-TV.

Because of Charter Communications' gift, the studio will henceforth be known as the Charter Communications LUTV HD Studio. Wall pointed out that the Lindenwood television program and Charter Communications have a long history of collaboration. The program did not have a presence on the air until

establishing LUHE TV, which was on Charter Cable TV at channel 26 until the channel moved to Charter's digital tier at channel 989.

In addition to Wall, the ceremony included remarks by Lindenwood President James D. Evans, Ph.D.; Steve Trippe, Charter Communications vice president and general manager; and Jim J. Shoemake, chairman of Lindenwood's Board of Directors, who formally named the facility on behalf of the board.

The first live newscasts produced at the studio began after the ceremony. Future programming includes recorded and live broadcast of Lindenwood's Second Annual High School History Bowl and an evening of live coverage on election night (Nov. 4).

Crisis Training for Youth Group Leaders Oct. 28

The Lindenwood University Center for Christian Ministry Studies will host "Helping Kids Cope: Crisis Training for Religious Youth Group Leaders" from 2:30-4:30 p.m. on Tuesday, Oct. 28, in the Leadership Room of the Spellmann Campus Center. The presentation is co-sponsored by the Missouri Foundation for Health and the Lindenwood nonprofit administration and professional and school counseling programs.

Rhonda Coleman, grant coordinator for the United Church of Christ's Missouri Mid-South Conference, and adjunct instructor at the University of Missouri-St. Louis, will present on topics relevant to those preparing to work with adolescents in religious and educational settings.

Attendants will learn to recognize symptoms of Post Traumatic Stress Disorder (PTSD); understand PTSD risk factors; identify signs and symptoms of depression, domestic violence, alcoholism, drug addiction, family dysfunction, and other traumas; strengthen coping skills and ego strength; understand principles and phases of Critical Incident Stress Debriefing (CISD); and outline basic crisis management safety protocols.
