LU Campus Mourns a 'Great Professor'



The Lindenwood University campus is mourning Dr. Larry Matthews of the School of Education. Matthews passed away on Friday after fainting during a game of tennis with a friend. He is believed to have died from heart failure.

"Larry was one of our most loved and appreciated Education professors, and he shall be missed

in the most acute way for a long time," said Dr. James Evans in a message to the faculty and staff on Saturday. "Please join us in praying for his family and many friends during this time of grief and adjustment."

Matthews, pictured above, joined the Lindenwood faculty in 2000 as the paper. a professor of education and mathematics. He earned his bachelor's degree from the University of Tennessee-Knoxville, his master's from the University of Tennessee-Martin, and his Ph.D. from St. Louis University.

A visitation is scheduled for 4 to 6 p.m. on Wednesday at St. John's Lutheran Church, 15800 Manchester Road, in Ellisville, Mo.; the visitation will be followed by a memorial service at 6:30 p.m. The church is located on Manchester Road near Clarkson Road.

"I've known Larry Matthews for 33 years," said Dr. Rick Boyle, vice president for human resources, and former dean of the School of Education. "I first met him as a student at St. Louis University when we were in the doctoral program. He was one of the kindest, most compassionate, most helpful individuals I have ever met. He helped people to get over the math phobia that so many have. He had a unique way of helping those folks get over that hurdle. He leaves an unfillable space in our lives. He has a lovely family, a wonderful wife, Barbara, and three sons."

East Asia Expert to Speak on Future of China

Dr. Ross Terrill, expert on East Asia, will discuss the future of China at Lindenwood University at 7 p.m. on Tuesday, Nov. 11, as part of the school's 2008-09 Speaker Series. The event, which will be in Spellmann Center's Anheuser-Busch Leadership Room on the main campus (209 S. Kingshighway, St. Charles, MO 63301), is free and open to the public. Terrill's talk is titled "China: On the Edge of Greatness or Peril."

Terrill is a China specialist and research associate at Harvard's Fairbank Center for East Asian Studies. The author of nine books, Terrill was raised in rural Australia, graduated with first class honors in history and political science from the University of Melbourne in 1962 and served in the Australian Army

He won a Frank Knox Fellowship to Harvard University and earned a Ph.D. in political science in 1970. His thesis on the philosophy of R. H. Tawney was awarded the Sumner Prize and was later published as Socialism As Fellowship. He was appointed to the Harvard faculty upon completion of his doctorate and became associate professor in 1974.
